When we get to know and understand God better, we realize that He wants us to have a good time. But he also wants us to be safe. That's why he gave us parents to help us know what is safe and what is not. God wants us to have fun without getting hurt. That is why God

has certain rules about what we can do and what we can't.

God is Good!

God is full of love. In fact, love is what God is all about. Being loving and kind is God's favorite thing to do. That is why God made people and animals. When loving is your favorite thing, then you need somebody to love. So God made all sorts of creatures, both in heaven and on Earth. He did that so he could love them and be good to them. God wants to be with those he made. He wants to help them and talk to them. Yes, God even talks to animals! God is always reaching out to us from heaven.



God is Mysterious

God is real. He is not something someone made up. If we were going to make up what God was like, we could imagine he was very simple. We could know everything there was to know about a make-believe god, because we could imagine him however we wanted. But because God is real and not imaginary, some things about Him are hard to understand.



That is why I say that God is mysterious. But that's okay. A real mystery is always better than a made-up story! I am going to tell you one of the mysterious things about God. Some people might think you are not old enough to understand this, but I bet you are! I

think you can understand everything about God that He wants you to know.

When I was a little boy I asked my Sunday School teacher a question about God and she said I was too young to understand. I didn't like that. I wanted to know the answer to my question. I bet you would not like it if I told you something like that. But don't worry, I won't. I am going to explain to you what I asked my teacher about. Are you ready to hear something mysterious about God?


Here we go: First of all, there is only one God. You probably already knew that. There are not many gods. There are not even two gods. There is only one God, and he made everything. But now, here is the mystery: God is three people in one! I know what you are thinking. You are like, "What?" Yes, that's what I said. There is only one God, but He is made up of three people.

How could that be? It is not really so hard to believe if you think about it for a minute. Think about an egg. It has three parts. It has a shell, a yoke, and a white. Three parts, but only one egg. God is sort of like that. Three persons, but one God. Bible teachers call this three-in-

one God "the Trinity" because "trinity" means three. That is probably a new word for you.

Now comparing God to an egg is not a perfect way to explain this. It only helps a little because God is way more awesome and mysterious than an egg. We can't understand it completely because God is so amazing. But we can believe it. God told us that is how it is, so we can trust that it is true.

The three persons that are God have names. First, there is the Father. He is the first person of the Trinity. Then there is the Son, and his name is Jesus. He is the second person of the Trinity. Finally, there is the Holy Spirit. Bible teachers call him the third person of the Trinity. You don't have to remember who is first, second, or third because they are all equal. They are all one God, and they have always existed.



It's like this: God is so full of love that within Himself there are three people that love each other and are always in agreement. And because God is three persons in one, He can love us and care for us in more ways than we can even imagine.

The Bad Guy

In this story there is a bad guy. He is called the devil, and his name is Satan. Maybe you have heard of him. I will tell you the truth about him just like the Bible tells it.

Long ago, God made angels in heaven. Satan was one of those angels but he was a very special angel. The Bible says that Satan was very powerful and beautiful. God had a plan for Satan. God knew he was going to make the world, and he wanted Satan to watch

over the Earth and help God take care of the people He would make.

But something terrible happened. Satan had free will, just like we do. Let me explain what free will is. Having free will means that we can decide if we want to do right or do wrong. You know what I am talking about because we all know what it is like when we choose to do something that we know is bad. Have you ever told a lie? Perhaps you told your parents you did a chore, but you didn't really do it. You knew it was wrong because you felt bad about it later. Or maybe you thought about not doing something you were told by your parents to do, but you didn't do it. But then you decided to do it because you wanted to do what was right. It felt good to do right, didn't it?

So you see, we always have a choice to do right or wrong. That is what free will is. We can choose to be good or bad. Well, Satan had that choice also. He decided to be bad.

Satan was so beautiful that he became filled with pride. He thought he was better than anyone else. In fact, he was so prideful that he imagined that he was greater than God. He wanted to take God's place.

Satan got a bunch of other angels to disobey God also. They tried to attack God in heaven. Of course, they didn't win, and God threw them out of heaven. No one is more powerful than God. After that happened, Satan became even more evil and wanted to fight against everything that God does.



God Makes the World

God decided to make people that were more like Himself than any other creature he had ever made. He was going to create people. But first, he had to make the Earth and prepare it for the people he was going to make.

So God made the Earth. At first it was all covered with water, but then he made the dry land appear, and He made the water go into lakes, rivers, and oceans. Then God made all the trees and plants to grow. Trees normally grow slowly, but when God first made the Earth, he made them grow up instantly so the Earth would be ready for what He would do next.



Then God made all the stars in the sky. He placed Earth in a special place in our galaxy, which we call the Milky Way. God put the

Earth in the safest place in our galaxy. Some areas of our galaxy are not suitable for life. God also made some huge planets like Jupiter and Saturn to be on the outer edge of our solar system so they would shield the Earth from the many asteroids flying through space. Because those planets are so big, they have very strong gravity, and they can pull the asteroids away from Earth.

God also made the Earth just the right size so that there would be the right amount of gravity. If the Earth were much bigger, gravity would be so strong that we would weigh a thousand pounds! We would not be able to move. And if the Earth were too small, gravity would be too weak, and we would not be able to walk normally. God thought of everything and he made everything just right!

God created the moon so that we would have light at night. We don't depend on the moon's light as much now because we have electric lights, but for most of history, people have not had electricity. So it was very important to have the moon and stars, for without them you would not be able to see your hand in front of your face at nighttime! The moon also helps us with other things. We set our calendar by the moon. The moon goes around the Earth once about every 27 days. That is why our months are about the same length. Here is something else amazing: The moon is exactly 400 times smaller than the sun, but it is also 400 times closer to us than the sun. That makes the moon look to be the same exact size as the sun. God worked everything out perfectly so we would have a nightlight exactly like the sun, only not so bright.

If the moon were closer to the Earth, its gravity would make all kinds of problems for us on Earth. If it were farther from the Earth, we would not have ocean tides. We need tides because they help circulate the water in the ocean and keep it clean. God put the moon at a perfect distance from the Earth.

If we didn't have the moon at all, we would be in big trouble! The Earth wobbles as it spins, and this gives us our seasons. Have you ever seen a top wobble as it spins? That is what the Earth does. Because God put the moon in just the right place, the moon's gravity helps stabilize the Earth's wobble. If the moon weren't exactly where it is, the Earth would wobble so much that winter would be way too cold, and in the summer, we would burn up!

God made an atmosphere of air on the Earth so people could breathe. He also put the Earth at the exact proper distance from the sun, so it would not be too hot or cold. God created everything just right for us to live here. Astronomers who study the stars have noticed that no other planet has everything just perfect like the Earth does.

That is because God created the Earth just for us so we would have a nice place to live. If you ever hear someone say the Earth just came about by accident, you will know that they don't know about all the scientific reasons that show the Earth is unique. The unique qualities of Earth show that it was specially created by God just for us.

Next, God made all the fish that live in the lakes, rivers and oceans. After that, he made all the animals. And then finally, the Earth was ready for his master plan. It was ready for people.

Created in God's Image

First, God made one person, a man that he called Adam. God made his body, and then God created Adam's spirit to live inside his body. Once God made Adam's spirit, then Adam opened his eyes, and he was alive.

Adam was very different from any creature God had made before. God had said, "Let us make man in our own image." Wait! Why did God say "us?" Who was He talking to? Remember, God is three persons in one, so that is why he said, "Let us make man in our own image."

What does it mean to be made in God's image? First of all, people have abilities that are greater than what animals can do. We can think about the past and the future. We can consider our past actions and decide if they were good or bad. We can create a picture in our mind and make plans for making something that is just like the thing we thought about. Just like God, we are very creative. We can write poems and stories, or even stories about stories. This ability is called being capable of abstract thought.

People have both spoken and written languages. We are capable of deep love and

self-sacrifice for others. We have a conscience. This means we know whether what we are doing is right or wrong, and we can choose our actions based upon whether we think they are good or bad.

None of the animals have these kinds of abilities as much as people do. Do you think a dog or a cat ever thought about what it wanted to do ten years from now? Does a monkey think about whether it should make plans to help the poor? No, I don't think so either! So you see, people are different from animals in many ways. That is because we are created in God's image, which simply means we are very much like Him on the inside.

Maybe you have heard people say that people are animals or that animals turned into people. Don't believe it! Some people only think that because they don't know what the Bible says.

Yes, we are similar to animals in some ways because we have the same Creator. God made man and animals to live in the same Earth environment and he wanted us to relate to each on some level. Because of that, we have some things in common with the animals. But we still are quite different from animals because

we are created in the image of God and animals are not. That is why God put man in charge of the animals because He knew that we could plan ahead to love and care for other creatures better than anything else that God had created.

An example of how people are helping animals is how logging is being done in our forests. Logging companies cut down trees so that we have wood to make houses, furniture, paper, and all sorts of nice things. Did you know that Jesus was a carpenter? Carpenters specialize in making things out of wood. One of the reasons God made forests was so that we could use trees to make the things we need.

But animals live in the forest, so we have to think about them too, because God gave us the authority to be over the animals. The forest service requires that logging companies leave many trees still standing, and they also insist that they thin out the underbrush when they cut down the trees. Not only does this make the forest look nicer, but doing that has another important advantage.

If a forest fire gets to where the trees were cut, there are not many bushes and old dead trees for the fire to burn. So what happens is that the fire slows down so much that the firefighters have time to rush in on the logging roads made by the logging company, and they can quickly put the fire out because there was not much old dead wood there to burn.

And that is very good news for all the animals that live in the forest. You see, man can plan it all out ahead of time so that people have wood to make things, and the forest and animals are protected too.

Now, do you think there is any animal that could have planned all that out? Just imagine: A bear says to other bears, "We need to plan this out so that the deer won't get burned up in a fire." That's silly, isn't it? Bears can't talk, and even if they could, they wouldn't care about the deer, and they certainly could not think about such complicated future plans. So you see, man and animals are two very different creatures. Do you see now how silly it would be to say that man is an animal? We are special and different from animals because we are created in God's image.

Boys and Girls

Let me tell you something else the Bible tells us. I will quote it to you exactly the way

the Bible says it: "On the day when God created man...he created them male and female." That verse is right at the beginning of the Bible, in a book called Genesis. So it must be very important. So boys and girls, it has been that way ever since God made the first people. He made them to be boys and girls that grow up to be men and women.



Perhaps you have heard someone say that there are more than two genders, that there are boys and girls, but also something in between. I want you to know that idea is very silly. People who say that just don't know what the Bible says.

You also might have heard someone say that a person can decide if they want to be a boy or a girl. Well, people can make-believe lots of crazy things. You could pretend you are a dinosaur, but that wouldn't really make you one, would it?

While we are on this subject, let me quote another very important Bible verse. This verse is also in Genesis, and it is so important that Jesus quoted it. Here it is: "Therefore a man shall leave his father and his mother and hold fast to his wife, and they shall become one flesh."

This tells us that God's plan is for a man and a woman to get married. Then they can have children. And their children will be boys and girls also. When a boy grows up, he can marry a woman, and when a girl grows up, she can marry a man. That is God's plan.

God told the first people: "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the Earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground." Having children is a good thing. It is God's plan. Some people think that having lots of babies is wrong. They don't know what they are talking about. If married people want to have children, that is a good thing, and it pleases God because He loves children very much.

Today, some people say it is alright for men to marry men or women to marry women, but that is not true. God says that doing something like that is disgusting to Him. The Bible says such a thing is a terrible sin that will lead to awful consequences.

Two men or two women can't have a baby. Only a man and a woman can have children. That shows us from nature that God intended men and women to marry. Only a married man and woman can follow God's command to be "fruitful and increase in number."



And now, we are finally ready to begin the amazing story that I have been waiting to tell you. So here we go: Once upon a time, a long time ago...wait a minute! That is how fairy tales start, and this isn't a fairy tale. This is a true story.



So let's start another way. How about this? About six thousand years ago...Yeah, I know, that is still a long time ago. I just wanted to make sure you remembered this all really

happened, and it happened, just like I said, about six thousand years ago. How do we know? Well, I'm going to tell you.

But wait – I bet you can guess how we know. That's right! We know it because the Bible says so! You see, the Bible tells who Jesus' parents were and who His grandparents were and who their parents were, and it goes on and on like that, giving all the names going all the way back to Adam. The Bible even tells how long those people lived.

So from that, we can figure out that Adam lived about four thousand years before Jesus, and Jesus lived about two thousand years ago. So if you add four thousand to two thousand, you get six thousand. So that is how we know that Adam lived about six thousand years ago. Now I promise – no more math!

Maybe you have heard people talk about what happened on the Earth millions of years ago. They only say that because they don't understand what the Bible really says. And some people say it because they don't want to know God, and they want to disagree with the Bible.

The thing to remember is that the Earth has only been here for about six thousand years, and Jesus was real, and so was Adam because the Bible says that Adam was an ancestor of Jesus. Think about it: Adam was just as real as Jesus was. Jesus and His disciples taught us that Adam really was the first man on Earth.

It's About Time

God made time also. I bet you didn't even think about that! You see, where God lives in heaven, there is no passage of time, like there is here on Earth. God is outside of time in what we call eternity. We can't imagine that because we live inside of time. So don't worry if it doesn't make sense. I don't even completely understand it myself! We can just believe it because the Bible says it is true. When God made the universe, he also made time.

Did you know that scientists have discovered that space, time, and gravity are all related and connected somehow? We have found out that clocks on satellites in outer space move more slowly than clocks on Earth. Why is that? It is because they are farther from Earth's gravity, so they experience time more slowly. So you see, there is a mysterious relationship between gravity and time.

Speed and time are also strangely connected. How fast something is traveling can change time. For example, if you were on a spaceship that went almost as fast as the speed of light, time would slow way down for you. Isn't that remarkable? I don't understand it, but it certainly is interesting!



Space—Time—Gravity Interconnection

Have you ever heard someone say that a particular star is a million light-years away? That means that a star is so far away that it takes the star's light one million years to get to Earth. Now, since you are so smart, I bet you have a question. If everything was made six thousand years ago, how can a star be a million light-years away? How can we see it? It would

take a million years for its light to get to Earth, wouldn't it? So if the Earth is only six thousand years old, why can we see light that comes from a million light-years away?

Great question! I will tell you the answer because I promised you that I wouldn't tell you that you are too young to understand. You see, the speed of time is not always the same. Time moves at different speeds in different places in space, depending on gravity. The speed of time also depends on how fast an object is moving.

Now the Bible says that God "stretched out the heavens" when he made the universe. That changes everything! Remember that time is affected by the speed of an object. When God stretched out the heavens at the speed of light, many things were being affected.

Space, gravity, and even the speed of light were all changing at the moment of creation of the universe. These changes would affect the speed of time. When God stretched out the heavens, the light beams from stars were stretched out also. Even time itself was likely stretched. This is all very complicated stuff, and it makes my head spin! I bet it does yours too!

What may have been a very long time far out in space could have just been a day here on Earth. While God was in the process of making everything in six literal days on Earth, all the things that affect space and time were quickly changing. So the distance of the stars does not tell us anything about how old the Earth really is.

What all this means is that there is a lot that man does not know about. But we know this for sure: We are not smarter than God. He tells us that he made the heavens and the Earth in six days and that this happened about six thousand years ago. Since God said it, we can believe it.

Adam and Eve

God made a beautiful garden for Adam. It was called the Garden of Eden, and it was the most perfect place on Earth. It had a river flowing through it with flowers and trees along the banks of the river. The garden was huge! It had meadows full of green grass and lovely flowers of many different colors.
